AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS GOVERNING CERTIFICATE, DIPLOMA AND POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA COURSES IN TULU

(Framed under Section 44 (1)(c) of the KSU Act 2000)

Preamble:

As per the directions received from the UGC the University has introduced Add-on courses for the students at the under-graduate level. These Add-on programs are categorised as Certificate/Diploma/Advanced diploma in an add – on course / programme. The eligibility condition for the programme is two years Pre-University Examinations conducted by the Pre-University Education Board in the State of Karnataka or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto by Mangalore University.

The University has been offering Certificate, Diploma and Post Graduate Diploma course in Tulu and the eligibility criteria for admission to this certificate courses / programmes is fixed as SSLC examination conducted by Karnataka Secondary Education Board or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto shall be eligible.

This difference in the eligibility criteria to other certificate programs offered by the University creates unnecessary confusion on the quality of the programmes offered. Therefore, the University has decided to have uniformity in the eligibility to all the certificate courses / programmes offered by the University.

Further, some of the Certificate / Diploma/ Advanced Diploma programmes are referred to as courses. As per the recent UGC nomenclature in CBCS and as well as NAAC nomenclature these are referred to as called programmes and individual papers are referred to as courses. Therefore, it is better that all these Certificate/Diploma/Post graduate Diploma courses are uniformly referred to as programmes. Hence, this amendment;

6. ATTENDANCE: Each paper shall be treated as an independent unit for the purpose of attendance. A student shall attend a minimum of 75% of the total instruction hours in a paper including tutorials and seminars. There shall be no provision for condonation of shortage of attendance and a student who fails to secure 75% attendance in any paper is not eligible for appearing the examination of that paper. He/she shall be required to repeat that paper by attending the classes.	6.ATTENDANCE: Each Course shall be treated as an independent unit for the purpose of attendance. A student shall attend a minimum of 75% of the total instruction hours in a course including tutorials and seminars. There shall be no provision for condonation of shortage of attendance and a student who fails to secure 75% attendance in any course is not eligible for appearing the examination of that course. He/she shall be required to repeat that course by attending the classes.

iii) **Post Graduate Diploma Programme in Tulu:** Tulu Language, Tulu Literature, Comparison study of Tulu with other Dravidian Languages, Tulu Folklore and Culture etc. and any other subjects introduced by the University from time to time.

9. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION & INSTRUCTION HOURS:

There shall be examinations at the end of academic year ordinarily during April/ May for Certificate Course and October/ November for Diploma Course and Post Graduate Diploma Course in Tulu. The scheme of examination are as below:

9. INTERNAL ASSESSMENT:

9.1 Marks for internal assessment shall be awarded on the basis of seminars, tests, assignments etc., as determined by the Board of Studies from time to time. The internal assessment marks shall be notified on the department/ college notice board for information of the students and it shall be communicated to the Registrar (Evaluation) at least 10 days before the commencement of the examinations. 9.2 Internal assessment marks shall be shown separately in the marks card. 10. REGISTERING FOR THE EXAMINATIONS: A candidate shall register for all the papers in the subject when he/ she appear for the examination for the first time.	10. 12. MINIMUM FOR A PASS: 12.1 No candidate shall be declared to have passed in the examination unless he/ she obtain not less than 40% marks in the University Examination in each theory papers/ Viva and 40% in theory and internal assessment marks put together. 12.2 There shall be no minimum in respect of internal assessment. 12.3 A Candidate who fails in any of the theory paper shall reappear in that theory paper and pass the examination subsequently.	12. MINIMUM FOR A PASS: 12.1 No candidate shall be declared to have passed in the examination unless he/ she obtain not less than 40% marks in the University Examination in each theory courses/ Viva and 40% in theory and internal assessment marks put together. 12.2 - No Change- 12.3A Candidate who fails in any of the theory course shall reappear in that theory course and pass the examination subsequently.								
13.CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES: The results of successful candidates at the end shall be classified on the basis of aggregate marks obtained. A candidate who has rejected the result shall appear for the immediately following regular examination. 14.2 The rejection shall be exercised only once and the rejection once exercised shall not be revoked. 14.3 Application for rejection along with the payment of the prescribed fee shall be submitted to the Registrar (Evaluation) through the study Centre together with the original statement of marks within 30 days from the date of publication of the result. 14.4 A candidate who has rejected the result is eligible only for class and not for ranking.	14.REJECTION OF RESULTS: 14.1A candidate may be permitted to reject the result of the whole examination.
