AMENDMENTS TO REGULATIONS GOVERNING CERTIFICATE, DIPLOMA AND POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA COURSES IN KODAVA

(Framed under Section 44 (1)(c) of the KSU Act 2000)

Preamble:

As per the directions received from the UGC the University has introduced Add-on courses for the students at the under-graduate level. These Add-on programs are categorised as Certificate/Diploma/Advanced diploma in anadd – on course / programme. The eligibility condition for the programme is two years Pre-University Examinations conducted by the Pre-University Education Board in the State of Karnataka or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto by Mangalore University.

The University has been offering Certificate, Diploma and Post Graduate Diploma course in Kodava and the eligibility criteria for admission to these certificate courses / programmes is fixed as SSLC examination conducted by Karnataka Secondary Education Board or any other examination considered as equivalent thereto shall be eligible.

This difference in the eligibility criteria to other certificate programs offered by the University creates unnecessary confusion on the quality of the programmes offered. Therefore, the University has decided to have uniformity in the eligibility to all the certificate courses / programmes offered by the University.

Further, some of the Certificate / Diploma/ Advanced Diploma programmes are referred to as courses. As per the recent UGC nomenclature in CBCS and as well as NAAC nomenclature these are referred to as called programes and individual papers are referred to as courses. Therefore, it is better that all these Certificate/Diploma/Post graduate Diploma courses are uniformly referred to as programmes. Hence, this amendment;

- ii) <u>Diploma Course</u>:- There shall be 15-18 hours of instruction per week totaling 600 hours of instruction per year.
- iii) <u>P.G. Diploma Course</u>:- There shall be 15-18 hours of instruction per week totaling 600 hours of instruction per year.
- ii) <u>Diploma Programme</u>:- There shall be 15-18 hours of instruction per week totaling 600 hours of instruction per year.
- iii) P.G. Diploma Programme: There shall be 15-18 hours of instruction per week totaling 600 hours of instruction per year.

6.ATTENDANCE:

Each paper shall be treated as an independent unit for the purpose of attendance. A student shall attend a minimum of 75% of the total instruction hours in a paper including tutorials and seminars. However, the shortage of attendance of students whose attendance is 60% and above but below 75% may be condoned by the University on payment of condonation fee as prescribed by the University and by following the rules prescribed for condonation.

6.ATTENDANCE:

Each Course shall be treated as an independent unit for the purpose of attendance. A student shall attend a minimum of 75% of the total instruction hours in a course including tutorials and seminars. There shall be no provision for condonation of shortage of attendance and a student who fails to secure 75% attendance in any course is not eligible for appearing the examination of that course. He/she shall be required to repeat that course by attending the classes.

7. MAXIMUM PERIOD FOR COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAMME:

The candidate shall complete the programme within the period prescribed in the regulation governing maximum period for completing various degree/diploma programmes notified by the University from time to time.

Kodava Language, and Literature, Comparative study with other Dravidian Languages, Kodava Folklore and Culture etc.and anyother subjects in Kodava introduced by the University from time to time.

8. SUBJECTS OF STUDY:

i) Certificate Programme in Kodava:

Introduction about Kodava region and Language, Communicative Kodava etc.

ii) Diploma Programme in Kodava:

Kodava Language, Kodava Literature, Folklore and Culture, Communicative Kodava etc.

iii) Post Graduate Diploma Programme in Kodava:

Kodava Language, and Literature, Comparative study with other Dravidian Languages, Kodava Folklore and Culture etc.and any other subjects in Kodava introduced by the University from time to time.

9. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:

There shall be examinations at the end of academic year ordinarily during November/ December for Certificate Course and April/ May for Diploma Course and Post Graduate Diploma Course in Kodava. The scheme of examination are as below:

15.2 The rejection shall be exercised only once and the rejection once exercised shall not be revoked.	
15.3 Application for rejection along with the payment of the prescribed fee shall be submitted to the Registrar (Evaluation) through the study Centre together with the original statement of marks within 30 days from the date of publication of the result.	
15.4 A candidate who has rejected the result is eligible only for class and not for ranking.
